President's Page

My dear fellow Veterans,

IAF is very proud of its veterans, who were the backbone of IAF, while serving the nation. Services rendered by veterans and their contributions have made the IAF one of the most modern and formidable Air Forces of the world today.

IAF is in the process of rapidly modernizing to keep pace with adversaries and emerging technologies. Acquisition and induction of new weapon platforms and systems to boost the operational capability is being pursued at an accelerated pace. Induction of Rafale and LCA embedded with cutting edge technologies is progressing well. Operationalisation of C-17 has made the transport fleet highly robust. Also induction of C-295 to replace vintage AVRO aircraft has commenced. Similarly new acquisitions and upgrade plans in respect of Helicopters. AEW&C, UAVs, MRSAM etc are progressing well. To minimize the dependency on foreign OEMs the indigenous defence manufacturing sector is being given a huge boost under the larger goal of achieving AtmaNirbharta.

Air warriors shall be glad to learn that during Galwan crises IAF had airlifted nearly 70000 troops and heavy platforms like tanks, artillery guns, and other heavy equipment weighing over 9000 tonnes as part of national efforts towards enhancing the overall preparedness in Eastern Ladakh along the line of control (LOC). In a mega capability boost, IAF rapidly operationalised Rafale, Chinook, Apache and S-400 and expedited integration of Brahmos and ASTRA missiles.



IAF has successfully reoriented plans for induction and training of Agniveervayus. IAF had received 7.6 lakhs applications for joining IAF as Agniveervayus. First batch of 2675 Agniveervayus have completed their training on 03 June 23 at ATS Sambra and have already joined the ranks at IAF. I would urge the veterans to interact with the Agniveervayus during your next visit to any Air Force establishment like CSD, ECHS, SMC etc. and motivate them to excel.

Indian space scientists and engineers have added another feather in their caps by successfully launching Chandrayaan-3 on 14 July 23 at 2.35 PM from Satish Dhawan space centre at Sriharikota, and soft landing of lander (Vikram) and deployment of Rover (Pragyaan) on 23rd August, to carry out in situ chemical analysis of the lunar surface during the course of its mobility. With successful completion of Chandrayaan-3 mission, India joins the elite club of three countries i.e. USA, Russia and China who have soft landed on the moon. We salute the spirit and enormous capability of Indian space scientists in the field of space technology. They have made the nation proud.

INDIAN AIR FORCE HERITAGE CENTRE, CHANDIGARH



Honourable Defence Minister Sh Rajnath Singh Jee inaugurated the nation's first Indian Air Force Heritage Centre, spanning 17000 Sq feet, in Sector 18 Chandigarh on 18 May 23. The sole aim of this is to preserve the rich heritage of the Indian Air Force and to inspire the young minds to join the Armed Forces.

Sh Banwarilal Purohit Honorable Governor of Punjab and Administrator of UT Chandigarh, Sh Dharam Pal IAS, Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari, Chandigarh MP Smt Kirron Kher and large number of Air Veterans along with Air Warriors were present on this occasion.

The main attractions of the heritage centre are five vintage aircraft and SAM-III Pechora

missiles safeguarding the Indian sky since decades. Air Force "Kanpur-I" is installed inside the centre, which was designed and built by Late Air Vice Marshal Harjinder Singh MBE (Member of the Order of the British Empire) in 1958. A GNAT aircraft (Sabre Slayer) of 1971 Fame is displayed on the main 'Chowraha' of the city and vintage aircraft like MiG-21, HPT-32, MiG-23 are installed in the centre which will serve as popular tourist attractions in the Tricity.

This centre displays the glorious history of IAF covering various war campaigns of IAF starting with the role of IAF in Indo-Pak war of 1947 to electro mechanical 3D-Dioramas depicting the latest operations of IAF such as the Balakot Strike. An augmented reality enclosure and a virtual reality enclosure will give the visitors a 3D real-time experience in the theme of the historic battle of Longewala. An audio-visual gallery will present the journey of IAF through time, tracing its evolution from its inception to the modern day as well as promotional movies on IAF. Holographic projection depicting aircraft interceptions and various aircraft on inventory of IAF will also be shown to the visitors.

The centre has scale models from the republic day tableau on display such as indigenous Tejas fighter aircraft, Prachand helicopter and AEW&C Netra aircraft as IAF initiative towards the vision of the "Atmanirbhar Bharat".

Miniature models of various missiles and bombs such as Astra, Rudram-II, Parlay etc. and 3D scale models of aircraft such as SU-30MKI, MiG-29, Mirage 2000, Mi-26 etc shall be on display.

The centre has a personal artefacts section displaying the personal belonging of various gallantry awardees of IAF and dedicated enclosures with Hyper-realistic mannequins of the legends of IAF such as MIAF Arjan Singh DFC and Air Cmde Mehar Singh MVC DSO.

This centre will also show various rescue operations being undertaken by the IAF all over the country and abroad. Initiatives undertaken by the Air Force Families Welfare Association for the benefit of the families of air warriors at the station, regional and central levels are shown on the projection screen.

A souvenir shop equipped with the IAF's merchandise has been set up and a unique aviation theme-based book café will also be operational for the public.

ACM PC LAL 38th MEMORIAL LECTURE



AIR Force Association organizes a memorial lecture every year in the memory of one of its most dynamic Chiefs Air Chief Marshal PC Lal. This is an annual feature of the AFA. This year the lecture was held on 28 June 23 at the Air Force Auditorium, Subroto Park.

Air Chief Marshal P C Lal was commissioned in the IAF in 1939. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross during the Burma Campaign in World War II. He served as the Vice Chief of the Air Staff in the 1965 war.

While on deputation to Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) in 1966, he served as the Chairman and Managing Director of HAL. As the seventh Chief of the Air Staff during the 1971 war, his

outstanding leadership proved to be a decisive factor in India's victory and the liberation of Bangladesh.

For his contributions in the two wars Air Chief Marshal PC Lal was awarded Padma Bhusan in 1966 and Padma Vibhushan in 1972. After his retirement from the IAF in 1973, he was appointed the Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) of Indian Airlines and later the Chairman of Air India.

Air Chief Marshal V R Chaudhari and several serving air warriors were present on the occasion. Four of the former Chiefs were also present in the lecture. Veteran Air Chief Marshal RKS Bhadauria who is the President Air Force Association extended a warm welcome to all present and introduced the Speaker to the audience of around 600 air warriors and air veterans.

Sh S Somanath who is holding three very important appointments delivered the lecture. Sh Somanath is Secretary, Department of Space, Chairman ISRO and Chairman Space Commission.

India will have to look at space as a "strategic asset" of the country and should become a worldleading space-faring nation by 2047. We have to look at space as a strategic asset of the nation. And we should create that capability, to sustain it, build it in an 'atmanirbhar' (self-reliant) way. It is very important and we have created a roadmap of how to build it, "And this is how we want to see India when it reaches the 100th year of its Independence. We would like to see India as a world-leading space-faring nation," he said.

During his presentation, he also spoke about the 'Space roadmap for Amrit Kaal' (2022 to 2047) delineating the various aspects the country needs to work on for the next 25 years.

Sh Somanath mentioned four levels the country needs to succeed at in its space roadmap --

strategic, spacecraft, innovation and exploration; continuing human space flight; launch cost reduction; and business of space travel, in that order.

Space parks, space tourism, global space data solution, global space manufacturing hub, and space mining with defined timelines too were mentioned in the PowerPoint slide he shared on the roadmap.

In his lecture, he also spoke of the Gaganyaan and Chandrayaan missions of India. In his address, the ISRO chief also underlined the need for sustainability in space. While sharing data on space debris in his slides, he said, of the nearly 14,000 satellites in orbit, "80 per cent are not functioning".



SHAURYA CHAKRAS TO IAF BRAVE HEARTS

GROUP CAPTAIN YK KANDALKHAR, FLT LT TEJPAL and LAC SUNIL KUMAR were awarded Shaurya Chakra for daring act of rescue of 35 standard persons from the Trikat Hills Ropeway Service in the Deoghar district of Jharkhand.







IAF contingent had the daunting task of climbing onto the stranded trolleys of the cable cart, while being attached to the helicopter's winch cable, accessing it from outside, strapping up each survivor individually and getting them winched up and into the helicopter hovering overhead. Smaller children were carried up to the helicopter by the Garuds themselves. The helicopter crew was faced with their own challenges where they had to maintain a steady hover, with practically no visual reference, in conditions of strong winds in the hilly terrain. The crew went from one trolley to the next to carry out their task, which was as risky for the crew as it was for the survivors of the mishap.



In a joint operation by the Garud team and Rashtriya Rifles Battalion SQN LDR SK JHAJHRIA AND CPL ANAND SINGH of Garud Flight engaged the terrorists during counter insurgency operations, in a face to face gun fight and succeeded in eliminating one terrorist and grievously injuring another. Sqn Ldr SK Jhajharia and Cpl Anand Kumar were awarded Shaurya Chakras.



FIRST WOMAN OFFICER TO GET GALLANTRY AWARD



Wg Cdr Deepika Mishra was commissioned on 15 Dec 2006. She is a trained Helicopter Pilot, qualified flying instructor and an instrument rated instructor and examiner. Wing Commander Deepika Mishra was assigned the task of carrying out Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief operations following flash floods in northern Madhya Pradesh. Her courageous actions and dedication to duty helped rescue 47 individuals, and as a result, she became the first woman Air Force officer to be honored with a gallantry award, the Vayu Sena Medal for gallantry, which she received from Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari at an investiture ceremony held in New Delhi.

He has many firsts to his credit including the first night flight of the LCA and the first landing at Leh, He was the leader of the formation that carried out the LGB attack on Tiger Hill.

Satellite-based real time aircraft tracking system: IAF Maintenance Command has developed a satellite-based real time aircraft tracking system that can get information about the location of an aircraft, Air Marshal Vibhas Pande, Air Officer Commanding in Chief (AOC-in-C), Maintenance Command has said that the aircraft tracking system would be implemented once the final trial pending in the eastern sector gets over. "One of the Base Repair Depots (BRDs) under the aegis of Air Force's Maintenance Command has indigenously developed a real time aircraft tracking system, wherein the Air Force can get the update on the location of a flying aircraft every 30 seconds. The tracking system is satellite-based and can track the path of an aircraft.

HAR KAAM DESH KE NAAM: PRESIDENT OF INDIA REVIEWS THE COMBINED GRADUATION PARADE AT AFA

Smt Droupadi Murmu, the President of India, reviewed the Combined Graduation Parade (CGP) of the 211th Course on 17 June 23 with full Military splendor at Air Force Academy (AFA), Dundigal . This is the first occasion in the history of AFA when the Honorable President of India was the reviewing officer.

In her address, the President said that the Indian Air Force is taking steps to be future ready keeping in view the overall security scenario, including challenges of fighting a high technology war in a network-centric future battle space.

Addressing the gathering, Supreme Commander of the Indian Armed Forces said that the great role played by the brave warriors of the IAF in defending the country in the wars of 1948, 1965 and 1971 is written in golden letters.

"They demonstrated the same resolve and skills at the Kargil conflict and later, in destroying the terror hideout at Balakot," the President said hailing the IAF. She further said that the IAF also contributes to humanitarian assistance and disaster relief. "Recently the IAF sprang into action despite adverse weather conditions during the recent earthquake in Turkey and Syria to provide medical aid and disaster relief. Earlier, the successful evacuation operation to airlift more than 600 Indians and other nationals stuck in Kabul, involving flying and landing in a hostile environment is a testimony to the high capabilities of the Indian Air Force," she said.

Flying Officer Nitesh Jakhar of the Flying branch was awarded the Sword of Honor for standing first in order of merit at the 211th Combined Graduation Parade.

194 flight cadets (including 39 women cadets) of flying and ground duty branches were awarded commission on successful completion of their training.

WHY ELECTRIC CARS

Electric Cars are more economical to operate over their lifetime due to lower repair and maintenance costs than that of Petrol and Diesel cars. This is because electric cars have lesser number of parts, no combustion engine, no oil lubricants and reduced break wear.

Electric cars are the future because there are no emissions of Electric Cars. Electricity, as a fuel, is less expensive than Petrol / Diesel. They are more comfortable and quiet. There is no need to switch gears in electric cars.

However, there are certain major disadvantages. Electric cars are made of three crucial elements: electric motor, transmission and battery pack. Battery pack is the most expensive. These batteries are different than the conventional batteries. They are made of rare earth elements like Lithium, Cobalt and Nickel, which are very expensive.

In addition ECs have a few major disadvantages namely: very limited running range (say 200 to 300 kilometers), High battery replacement costs, Inadequacy of battery charging infrastructure, Long charge time: Continuous availability of electricity for repeated charging, Low top speed, Fear of battery draining out while on road etc.

Therefore, despite financial incentives being offered by Government, people are not very enthusiastic about buying electric cars (unlike E - scooters, E - motorcycles and E- Rickshaws) until we get more robust and economical batteries in addition to more battery charging systems.

IAF Multi-Nation Exercises - Training for Global Action Veteran Air Marshal Anil Chopra (DG Centre for Air Power Studies)



IAF is fast transforming from a continental air force to one with global reach. It now has trans-domain operations capability, and prides itself for its reach, flexibility, versatility, responsiveness, and offensive lethality. In keeping with the evolutionary nature of air power and the need to stay relevant across the spectrum of conflict in an inter-connected environment, IAF has been exercising with various Air Forces of the world as enumerated in the succeeding paragraphs.

USAF and IAF participate in bilateral US Pacific Air Forces (PACAF) sponsored Field Training Exercise (FTX) Cope India series, conducted in India. Beginning at Gwalior in February 2004, the exercise was repeated in many subsequent years. Cope India-2023 was held in April this year across Kalaikunda, Panagarh and Agra bases. IAF and US Air Force (USAF) have also been participating in exercise 'Red Flag' in Nellis Air Force Base, and at Eielson AFB in Alaska in the United States.

French Air and Space Force and IAF have been participating in Exercise 'Garuda' series since the first joint exercise in 2003. The locations included Istres and Mont-de-Marson in France and Jodhpur and Kalaikunda in India.

IAF participated in Exercise Orion at the Mont-de-Marsan airbase in France.

Royal Australian Air Force and IAF participated in the 17-nation Multilateral Exercise 'Pitch Black' held at Darwin, Australia in September 2022, hosted by the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF). India began participating in 2018. All Quad members and many other Air Forces from Indo-Pacific were part of the exercise which had over 100 aircraft and 2500 military personnel participating.

The Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) and the IAF have been carrying out bilateral exercise SINDEX since 2004. They were held at airbases in India and Singapore.

Royal Air Force (RAF) and IAF have been conducting Exercise "Indradhanush" since 2006. This exercise is held in both India and the UK. The exercise includes close combat and Beyond Visual Range (BVR) engagements.

Desert Eagle is a multi-lateral exercise organized by United Arab Emirates Air Force. IAF has also been participating in exercise Eastern Bridge with Oman.

Blue Flag is a military aviation exercise held by the Israeli Air Force. In July 2022, the IAF carried out a one-month long engagement with the Egyptian Air Force (EAF) at the Egyptian Fighter Weapon School, located in Cairo West Air Force Base.

The Japanese Air Self Defence Force (JASDF) and IAF participated in bilateral air exercise SHINYUU Maitri-18 in 2018 at IAF airbase in Agra. In January 2023, the bilateral air exercise "Veer Guardian 2023' was held between the IAF and Japan Air Self Defence Force (JASDF) in Japan. IAF's Su-30 MKI and JASDF's F-2 and F-15 aircraft participated.

IAF also participated in exercise INIOCHOS at Andravida base in Greece, hosted by the Hellenic Air Force, held in April-May 2023.

The IAF's mega-multilateral, 12-nation, exercise 'Tarang Shakti' was scheduled to be held in October-November 2023 at Jodhpur (now postponed to middle of 2024). It is the biggest air exercise to be conducted in India. Large force engagements, long-range missions, and joint exercises with elements of Special Forces, and maritime strikes are planned.

In the last few years, IAF's global engagements are on the rise. These multi-nation and bilateral exercises expose IAF's young air and ground crew, help imbibe new ideas, technologies, tactics, and improve interoperability with friendly foreign air forces.

- Two Months Quota: All CSD beneficiaries can buy two months quota of grocery & liquor in one
 month.
- Annual Renewal of CSD Smart Cards: For ESM, Defense Civilians & dependents have been discontinued.
- Simplification of Card Application Procedure: Application for CSD Smart Card to be self certified & countersigned by Canteen Officer itself. Only a copy of PPO/ Discharge Book is required to be attached.
- Gratis CSD Smart Cards: For War Windows & Next-of-Kin of Battle Casualties.

PURCHASE OF AFD ITEMS

- Online AFD Portal: An online Portal (https://afd.csdindia.gov.in) has been launched through which CSD beneficiaries can purchase AFD-1 items in lesser time through a completely online, convenient, and transparent process. Beneficiaries should avoid going to any middlemen touts asking for money for registration and demand creation on the portal.
- Purchase of Four Wheelers: Limits on purchase of four wheelers through CSD have been enhanced. Officers can now purchase cars costing up to 20 Lakh, JCOs up to 10 Lakh, and OR up to 8 Lakh. Additional 5 Lakh limit for purchase of EVs (Electric Vehicles)
- Periodicity AFD I (Less Four Wheelers): With effect from 01 Sep 2023, CSD beneficiaries can buy 02 TVs and 04 ACs in block period of 04 years, instead of one in four years.
- Purchase of AFD-II Items: AFD-II (include costly items like mattresses, sunglasses, vacuum cleaner, etc) items can now be bought on liquor & dependent cards also.

CSD SMART CARDS RELATED INITIATIVES

- Online Portal for CSD Smart Cards: Existing CSD Smart Card holders can now apply for new cards online and get cards delivered by courier at their home address within 7-15 days through this Portal (https://csdsmartcard.co.in)
- Activation of CSD Smart Cards: CSD Cards can now be activated from any Canteen instead of dependent/ parent Canteen.
- Officer Cadets at Training Academies: Permitted personalized CSD Smart Card' for purchase of grocery@ 5,000/- pm & AFD-II @ 20,000/- per yr.
- Agniveers & students of Sainik/ Military Schools/ RIMC: They are permitted to purchase grocery
 @ 3,500/- pm through Steel Cards.
- Newly Commissioned Officers & Agniveers; They are issued grocery & liquor cards at respective Training Academies & Centres on completion of training.

PREMATURE CLOSURE OF SCSS ACCOUNT (Rs 15 Lakhs)

- Interest rates for Senior Citizen Saving Scheme have now been increased from 7.4% to 8.2%.
- Premature withdrawal is permitted as the account can be closed any time before maturity period but with penalties. SCSS penalty rules for premature withdrawal are listed below –
 - (a) <u>Before completion of 1 year</u>: No interest will be paid. And any interest already paid will be recovered.
 - (b) After 1 year but before 2 years: 1.5% of the principal amount will be deducted.
 - (c) After 2 years but before 5 years: 1% of the principal amount will be deducted. SCSS account matures in 5 years, and can be extended for another 3 years.
- Extended account of 03 years after completion of initial 05 years: In such cases also the account can be closed but only after the expiry of one year from the date of extension without any deductions.

WOMEN CADETS AT NDA: Fifty Seven women cadets have joined NDA for training. (Nineteen women cadets each for 148,149 and 150 NDA course), out of which, one woman cadet has resigned. First batch of NDA women cadets (148th course is set to pass out in May 2025, Vacancy distribution for 19 women cadets is 10 for the Army, six for the IAF and three for Navy.

THREAT OF GROUND FIRE IN SUDAN IN MIDNIGHT OPERATION



Without any aid from the ground, and amidst the threat of attacks from ground on the aircraft, the Super Hercules, piloted by IAF officers, landed at the Wadi Sayyidna airstrip, about 40 km North of Khartoum in Sudan, to pick up the stranded passengers.

These passengers had no means of reaching Port Sudan to hop on to an Indian warship that was already carrying out evacuations from the war torn nation in the northeastern part of the African continent.

In a two-and-a-half hour midnight operation from war-torn Sudan, a C-130J aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF) rescued 121 people from a small airstrip at Wadi Sayyidna, which is about 40 km North of

Khartourn on the night of 27/28 April. The passengers, who were flown to Jeddah, included medical cases, including a pregnant lady, besides those who had no means to reach Port Sudan, the IAF said.

The airstrip in question has a degraded surface, with no navigational approach aids or fuel, and most critically the landing lights that are required to guide an aircraft landing at night, the IAF said in a statement.

"Approaching the airstrip, the aircrew used their Electro-Optical/Infra Red sensors to ensure that the runway was free from any obstructions and no inimical forces were in the vicinity. Having made sure of the same, the aircrew carried out a tactical approach on Night Vision Goggles (NVG), on a practically dark night," it stated. The convoy was led by the Indian Defence Attaché, who was in continuous touch with IAF authorities all along, till they reached the airstrip at Wadi Sayyidna.

Upon landing, the aircraft engines were kept running while eight IAF Garud Commandos secured the passengers and their luggage into the aircraft, As with the landing, the take off from the unlit runway was also carried out using Night Vision Goggles.

SERVICE OFFICERS POSTED ACROSS SERVICES

Indian Army officers will be posted to the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the Indian Navy and vice versa in an effort to ease the armed forces into the creation of integrated theatre commands, Officers from the IAF and the Navy will also be posted to serve in the Army.

Since the three services deploy a range of common Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs), surveillance radars, vehicles and telecommunication equipment, the cross-staffed officers will likely be tasked with handling logistics, reconnaissance, repair and recovery as well as supplies management.

GE AERO SPACE SIGNS MOU WITH HAL

GE Aerospace has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) to produce F414 fighter jet engines for the Indian Air Force.

The MoU between GE Aerospace and HAL includes provisions for a significant transfer of technology. The F414 engines will power the IAF's Light Combat Aircraft Mk2 jets.

INDIA INDUCTS NEW STRIKE-CAPABLE DRONES



The four new Heron Mark-2 drones, which can be equipped with long-range missiles and other weapons systems, have been deployed at a forward air base in the northern border by IAF. The drones with satellite communication capability have given a long desired capability to the Indian Air Force, as its drones can operate at very long distances for close to 36 hours at a stretch and can also laser illuminate enemy targets from very long ranges to help fighter aircraft destroy them using their long-range weapons. This is capable of longer endurance and has 'beyond line of sight' capability.

IGNOU DEGREES FOR AGNIVEERS

IGNOU signs an MoU with Armed Forces for skill-based bachelor degree programmes :

IGNOU has partnered with the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force to offer skill-based Bachelor degree programs for Agniveers.

The collaboration provides 120 credits, with IGNOU offering 60 credits and the Armed Forces offering the remaining 60 credits as in-service skill education. The admission process for the Indian Air Force commenced on 01 August 2023 with an exclusive Admission Portal for Agniveers. The application process is now open on the official website of IGNOU - ignou.ac.in.

Both technical and non-technical skill training received by the Agniveer will amount to 50 per cent of the credits required for a graduate degree. The rest of the 50 per cent will come from a basket of courses including subjects like languages, Economics, History, Political Science, Public Administration, Sociology, Mathematics, Education, Commerce, Tourism, Vocational Studies, Agriculture, Jyotish, ability enhancement courses on Environmental Studies and Communication Skills in English.

The collaboration aims to empower the Agniveers by enabling them to pursue a Bachelor's degree while actively serving in the forces. Upon completion of these skill-based programmes, the Agniveers' employability is expected to improve significantly after their service tenure. All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) and UGC have all recognized the framework of the programme. The Degree – BA, B.Com, BA (vocational) & BA (Tourism Management) – will be awarded by IGNOU as per UGC, and will be recognized both in India and abroad.

Defence Services have been having women officers for quite some time. It started with the induction of Medical officers and Dental officers. Subsequently, women officers were commissioned into many other Branches. Very recently, the women have been inducted as Agniveer Women also in all the three arms. Witnessing the Combined Graduation Parade at Air Force Academy had filled us with pride. The perfection and smartness on parade truly reflected the virtues of regimen and discipline.



Even so, many of

us couldn't help but notice two major variations in the parade.

The parade commander's words of command were stretched much longer than normal. This resulted in monotonous, long-drawn-out commands. Most of us simply accepted the change. But a revered senior seated next to me didn't hide his disappointment at this trend coming to AFA. "This style of command has come to AFA through the IMA and NDA route", he said.

We also noticed that pauses within multiple movements, in response to commands like Salami Shastra and Baju Shastra, were made longer than necessary. External prompts on the public address system were now required for synchronizing movements.

This parade took me 50 years back, to the Passing Out Parade of my senior course. The words of command by the parade commander, Pilot Officer RL Kamath, still ring fresh in my mind. I recall those words of command as crisp and yet rhythmic with changing tones. The loud and clear commands, not lost in monotones, were well understood by those in the galleries also.

An extra pause was introduced between movements. The parade couldn't adapt to the new timing. But the Chief Instructor didn't want the timing indicated by 'clicks' on the PA system. Well, we got it right when an instructor asked us to sing with him, "1-check-left-rt-2, check-left-rt-3, check-left-rt-10. Just one extra pause had indeed made the parade movements look elegant.

It's human to push the limits of what is aesthetic, effective and furthermore, appreciated. But too much of a good thing may become overwhelming. This is what seems to have happened with our parade. Stretching the lengths of commands and pauses hasn't done well for the overall effect.

Should we have to follow the Army? We made a change in our manner of saluting in 2005. The distinct Air Force salute has been acknowledged as one of the smartest, besides being uniquely identified with an air warrior. Keeping the basic parade structure same, hopefully we can bring back truly rhythmic commands and crisp movements.

Witnessing Ceremonial Parades continues to give us veterans a sense of pride. Comparisons with our times come out naturally, one sure thing; today's Air Warrior is outstanding. Whatever he does would be better than us!

BHARAT MANDAPAM AT INDIA TRADE PROMOTION ORGANISATION COMPLEX INAUGURATED IN DELHI



Bharat Mandapam: International Exhibitioncum-Convention Centre (IECC) developed at a cost of about Rs 2,700 Crore is the centerpiece of the Pragati Maidan complex. It is a grand architectural marvel, designed to host large-scale international exhibitions, trade fairs, conventions, conferences, and other prestigious events.

Its majestic multi-purpose hall and plenary hall have a combined capacity of seven thousand people, which is larger than the seating capacity of the famous Sydney Opera House in Australia.

Its magnificent amphitheater is equipped with a seating capacity of 3,000 individuals.

Shape of the building is derived from the Shankha (conch shell), and different walls and facades of the Convention Centre depict several elements of India's traditional art and culture including 'Surya Shakti' highlighting India's efforts in harnessing solar energy, 'Zero to ISRO', celebrating our achievements in space, Pancha Mahabhuta signifying the building blocks of universal foundation – Aakash (Sky), Vayu (Air), Agni (Fire), Jal (Water), Prithvi (Earth) also, among others. Various paintings and tribal art forms from different regions of the country adorn the Convention Centre.

Other facilities available in the Convention Centre include a 5G-enabled fully Wi-Fi-covered campus, 10G Intranet connectivity, an interpreter room equipped with cutting-edge technology to support 16 different languages, advanced AV systems with huge-sized video walls. Building management system ensuring optimal functionality and energy efficiency, light management system with dimming and occupancy sensors, state-of-the-art DCN (Data Communication Network) system, integrated surveillance system and energy-efficient centralized air conditioning system have also been installed.

UPDATE ON AFGIS SCHEMES

- AFGIS offers plenty of welfare schemes both for the serving airwarriors as well as the veterans.
 An update on a few of these schemes which may be of interest to the veterans is given below.
- 2. IAFSSDS: At the time of their retirement, airwarriors can park their hard earned money with AFGIS at very lucrative rate of interest. The present rate of interest is 7.75% for cumulative and 7.60% for non-cumulative schemes (Digitally signed soft copies of FDRs are forwarded to depositors at their registered Email ID. The provision for downloading the e-FDR is also available at DAV Portal https://iafpensioners.gov.in/ords/r/davportal/afgis/login under member's login). On maturity, the whole of maturity amount or part of it can be reinvested with AFGIS.
- Air Veterans Insurance Cover (AVIC Scheme): This scheme was originally known as Post Retirement Insurance Cover. It has been renamed as Air Veterans Insurance Cover. A summary of the scheme is tabulated below:-

THAL SENA BHAVAN: NEW BUILDING FOR ARMY HQs



"THAL SENA BHAVAN" will be the name of the new Headquarters for the Indian Army. The construction of this newly conceptualized and modern state-of-the —art complex being developed in area of 7.5 Lakh Sq Mtr has begun in Jan 2023 at a site measuring approximately 40 acres in the Delhi cantonment area. It will be located opposite the Manekshaw Centre and the new complex is expected to cost Rs.832 Crores and is due to be ready by 2025.

The Thal Sena Bhawan would have a ground plus seven-storey main office complex that will cater to more than 5,600 personnel, a facility zone, an infrastructure complex, single men living accommodation, vehicle parking, engineering services area, among others.

The new building would also have a fully networked operations room, conference rooms with digital interface, gymnasium, creche and a health centre and a common library. "The That Sena Bhawan" will be a functionally robust GRIHA-compliant, earthquake resistant building with dedicated spaces for various directorates and departments. Centrally air-conditioned, the main office complex will have adequate number of conference halls with digital interface, briefing rooms, waiting areas for visitors and drivers and common areas with all amenities. Central Control Room and Integrated Building Management System will be provided to ensure the desired level of security of the complex.

FOR BRIGADIER AND ABOVE RANK OFFICERS

Officers of the rank of Brigadiers and above, who are also known as Flag Rank officers will now be wearing a standardized and common uniform. This includes headgear, shoulder rank badges, gorget patches, belts and shoes. Until now they have been wearing uniform specific to their parent regiments. These regimental uniforms will continue to be worn by all Jawans, JCOs and officers upto the rank of Colonel. The Flag officers will not be wearing any lanyards under the new change.

AIR FORCE DAY PARADE

As a part of its annual celebrations, the Air Force holds Air Force Day Parade on 08 October every year. This parade was earlier held at Air Force Station Palam and was later on shifted to Air Force Station Hindon.

Keeping in mind the air space constraints in and around Delhi and also the vehicular traffic at Delhi, it has been decided to hold this parade outside Delhi. AF Day Parade 2022 was held at AF Station Chandigarh. The Indian Air Force will be celebrating its 91st anniversary on 08 October 2023. The AF Day parade would be conducted at Air Force Station Bamrauli and the Air Display would be conducted over the Sangam area, in the vicinity of the Ordnance Depot Fort in Prayagraj. The scenic surroundings would add to the appeal of the stream of aircraft flying-by in close formation.

The Air Force Day Celebrations will actually commence more than a week before this with an Air Display near Bhojtal Lake at Bhopal Madhya Pradesh on 30 September 2023.

NEW PARLIAMENT HOUSE



As part of India's Central Vista Redevelopment Project, a new parliament building located at Rafi Marg, New Delhi has been constructed in New Delhi. The same has been inaugurated on 28 May 2023 by the Honorable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi.

The original building, a 93-year-old structure, suffered from inadequate space for house members and their staff, and design changes that put its structural stability at risk as it wasn't earthquake-proof.

The new hexagonal complex, area 20866 square meters shall be earthquake resistant and has 888 seats in the Lok Sabha chamber and 384 seats in the Rajya Sabha chamber. Unlike the old parliament building, it does not have a central hall. The Lok Sabha chamber will be able to house 1,272 members in case of a joint session.

The Parliament House has three entrances, named Gyan Dwar (knowledge gate), Shakti Dwar (power gate), and Karma Dwar (karma gate). There are six guardian statues that man the three entrances, namely, Gaja, Ashwa, Garuda, Makar, Shardula, and Hams.

TRAINER (HTT-40) AIRCRAFT BY IAF FROM HAL



AF is purchasing 70 Hindustan Turbo Trainer-40 (HTT-40) basic trainer aircraft (BTA) from Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) at a cost of Rs 6,828 Crore. These aircraft will be delivered over a period of six years.

The HTT-40 is a turboprop aircraft, designed to have good low-speed handling capabilities for better training effectiveness. This fully aerobatic, tandem-seat, turbo trainer has an air-conditioned cockpit, modern avionics, hot refueling, running changeover, and zero-zero altitude ejection seats.

The aircraft will meet the shortage of Basic Training Aircraft for training of newly inducted pilots of the IAF. The purchase price will include associated ground equipment and training aids including simulators. Being a fully indigenous trainer, the BTA is configurable for upgrades to incorporate the futuristic requirements of the Indian armed forces.

The HTT-40, which is designed, developed, test-flown and validated by HAL, contains approximately 56 per cent of indigenous content.

The initial 70 trainers will be built at the Bangalore facility of HAL and for series production it will move to Nashik as HAL is hoping to get an order of 106 basic trainers from IAF.

SUPREME COURT EASES PROCEDURE FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF LIVING WILL (HOW TO DIE WITH DIGNITY)



In a landmark judgment in March 2023, Supreme Court modified its 2018 guidelines on LIVING WILL and has eased the procedures, to execute LIVING WILL (formally called Advance Medical Directive), to allow peaceful death by passive euthanasia. Peaceful euthanasia means withdrawal of medical treatment with the deliberate intention to hasten a terminally ill patients' death. An article on living will was earlier written in Eagles' Eye – Mar 21 (61st edition).

Supreme Court Decision : Supreme Court's decision recognized the Right to Die With

Dignity as part of the Fundamental Rights under article 21 of the Constitution. It permitted every Adult individual with mental capacity to make an informed decision and the right to refuse medical treatment and life support by executing an Advance Medical Directive or a Living Will. This will be enforced when the patient is terminally ill and not able to convey that treatment should stop.

Execution: Supreme Court modified its earlier ruling to simplify the guidelines for registration and execution of the Living Will. It can be made on plain paper. The following conditions are mandatory. (a) The individual's signature on the living will is to be witnessed by two independent witnesses. (b). Needs to be attested by a Gazetted Officer / notary (c) The name of the Guardian/ Close relative who will be authorised to take the decision to withdraw the life support needs to be clearly mentioned.

The guidelines also state that a Medical Board of three expert doctors with a minimum of 5 years of experience will be appointed by the hospital.

Once this board certifies that the Living Will could be carried out the report would be forwarded to the District Collector. The DC would then constitute another medical board headed by the Chief Medical Officer along with three expert doctors. Both Medical Boards are to give their recommendations in 48 hours of the case being referred to them. In case the Boards refuse permission, the NOK has the right to approach the High Court. The High Court May constitute another Medical Board.

GLORIOUS MOMENTS IN THE HISTORY OF INDIAN SPORTS

- 1952 Khashaba Jadhav, the first Indian to win an individual Olympic medal for India. Jadhav won a bronze medal at the 1952 Summer Olympics in Helsinki
- 1958 Mihir Sen (famous Indian long distance swimmer and lawyer) crossed the English Channel and became the first Indian to do so.
- 1960 Milkha Singh (Flying Sikh). He was an Indian track and field sprinter who is best remembered for his fourth place finish in 1960. He broke the 400m Olympic record but lost the bronze by just 0.1 seconds.
- 1960 Ramanathan Krishnan reached world no.6 in Tennis rankings
- 1980 Praksh Padukone father of Indian Actor Deepika Padukone wins All England Badminton Title
- 1983 Cricket World Cup Victory. Repeated in 2011
- 1986 P. T. Usha's victory at Asian Games. Usha won four gold medals and one silver medal in the track and field events of the 1986 Asian Games.
- 1999 The amazing duo of <u>Leander Paes</u> and <u>Mahesh Bhupathi</u> reached the finals of the men's doubles in all four grand slams and the ATP Masters in 1999 and also won the French Open and Wimbledon.
- 2000 Karnam Malleswari becomes the first Indian woman to win an Olympic medal. Malleswari bagged a bronze in the 69 kg category of the weight-lifting championship at Sydney Olympics in 2000.
- 2000 Anand defeated Alexei Shirov in a six-game match to win the 2000 World Chess Championship.
- 2003 Anju Bobby George made history when she won the bronze medal in long jump at the 2003 World Championships in Athletics in Paris.
- 2004 2004 Kabaddi World Cup was the first ever Kabaddi World Cup and was hosted by India. India won the title defeating Iran 55–27 in the final.
- 2004 Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore AVSM wins Silver medal in Double Trap Shooting in 2004 Olympics in Athens Greece.
- 2005 Pankaj Advani won the World Billiards Championship at Quara Malta. He is a 25-time International Billiards and Snooker Federation world champion.
- 2005 Narain Karthikeyan became first Indian Racing Driver to compete in Formula 1 car race.
- 2007 Six sixes in an over by Cricketer Yuvraj Singh against England in T20 at Durban.
- 2008 Abhinav Apjit Bindra becomes the first Indian to hold concurrently the world and Olympic titles for the men's 10-meter air rifle event, having earned those honors at the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics and the 2006 ISSF World Shooting Championship at Zagreb, Croatia.
- 2009 Saina Nehwal becomes the first Indian woman to win a Super Series Tournament in Badminton
- > 2012 Sachin Tendulkar's 100th century and retirement from Cricket.
- 2014 Mary Kom's "golden" come back to become the first Indian female boxer to win a Gold Medal in Asian Games and again a Gold in 2018 commonwealth games.
- 2018 Saurabh Choudary wins Gold medal in the men's 10 meter Air Pistol event at Asian Games 2018.
- 2019 PV Sidhu becomes the first Indian to become Badminton's World Champion.

ATAL TUNNEL



(Named after the former Prime Minister Late Sh. Atal Bihari Vajpayee Jee): The tunnel has officially been certified by the World Book of Records, as the 'World's Longest Highway Tunnel above 10,000 Feet'. It is an engineering marvel connecting Manali to the Lahaul - Spiti Valley. Atal Tunnel runs under the 'Rohtang Pass' and was constructed on the Manali - Leh Highway. Construction of this tunnel has reduced the distance on Manali - Sarchu road by 46 km and travel time by four to five hours, providing all-weather connectivity on the Manali - Leh axis. The cost of entire project is Rs 3200 crores.

NATIONAL LOGISTICS MANAGEMENT SEMINAR, LOGISEM - 23



Logistics Management Seminar (LOGISEM – 23) was held on 16 May 23 at the AF Auditorium, Subroto Park, New Delhi. The topic for the seminar was; 'Leverage Emerging Global Supply Chain to Enhance Logistics Capabilities While Absorbing Disruptions'. The Seminar was inaugurated by Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari, Chief of the Air Staff.

"Global supply chains have become increasingly complex and interconnected, driven by the manuscripts of international trade and advances in technology," stated the Chief of the Air Staff in his address. The defence industry is

not immune to this tendency. To keep its combat capability at its peak, the IAF relies largely on worldwide supply chains to deliver key components, equipment and services. The world has recently witnessed numerous and diverse disruptions such as the COVID-19 epidemic, the Russia-Ukraine conflict, trade barriers, tariff conflicts, and environmental compliance rules. Such incidents have exposed the supply chain's susceptibility to disruption." "To mitigate such disruptions, emerging trends such as digitization, automation, and data analytics should be leveraged to enhance the IAF logistics capabilities," he added.

During the Seminar, notable Speakers deliberated and discussed problems related to the Seminar's theme for three hours. The topics covered included the domestic aviation industry's future prospects, new developments in supply chain management and warehousing, and public procurement activities through GeM (Government e Marketplace) which is an online platform for open and transparent procurement by all Government departments.

The Seminar provided an excellent forum for exchange of ideas between civil and military logisticians, and it is expected to help the IAF align and update its supply-chain requirements to new technologies and worldwide trends. The Seminar was also live-streamed throughout the IAF.

GOLDEN GLOBE RACE



Retired Naval aviator Commander Abhilash Tomy becomes the first Indian to complete a solo non-stop circumnavigation of the globe in a premodern era sailboat. It took him 236 days at sea all alone braving the rough seas.

Commander Tomy sailed into Les Sablesd'Olonne on the French coast touching the finishing line as the runner-up to the Golden Globe Race, 2023.

Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral R Hari Kumar and Chief of the Air Staff Air Chief Marshal

V R Chaudhari congratulated Cdr Tomy on this achievement.

Earlier also he had participated in the 2018 edition of the Golden Globe Race. He was forced to retire midway in 2018 race owing to a debilitating back injury sustained when a fierce storm had hit his boat in that race.

Five years later despite serious injuries sustained in 2018 race, with a titanium rod in his spine and five fused vertebrae, he has now aced the test of human spirit, mind, endurance, grit and determination. He now becomes the first Indian to complete this tough voyage.

What makes this voyage the toughest in the world is that the contestants were to sail for about 300 days traversing 30,000 miles non-stop with the technologies of 1968 vintage. This means they cannot use any of the modern electronics navigational aids.

SAREE CLAD WOMEN & CHANDRAYAAN -3



The Saree Clad Women of ISRO: Embracing the culture & behind Chandrayaan-3 success. Amid the landing of Chandrayaan-3 what really has been striking is the saree clad women scientists of ISRO. The women in ISRO were all elegantly draped in traditional sarees, to celebrate a monumental achievement. It is often believed by the people in the West that women in India are oppressed, and aren't educated or not even Independent.

Amid the intense atmosphere of anticipation and achievement, the sarees of women

symbolized a celebration of scientific success and a testament to the empowerment and unity that resonate through ISRO's endeavors. 

Just before leaving Kalam asked Sam "Are you comfortable? Is there anything I could do? or any requirement that would make you more comfortable?"



Sam said "Yes Your Excellency, I have one regret". Shocked with concern & anguish, the President enquired as to what it was.

Sam replied" Sir, my regret is that I am not able to get up & Salute the most respected President of my beloved country". Kalam held Sam's hand as both were in tears.

But the remaining part of the tale regarding this meeting is that Sam did tell APJ that he was not paid the pension of the Field Marshall's rank till then, for nearly twenty years. An aghast President went to Delhi and passed the pension with arrears within a week and sent the cheque of nearly Rs.1.25 crores through the Defence Secretary by a special plane to Wellington, Ooty, where Sam was ailing. That is the greatness of APJ.

But then Sam received the cheque and promptly donated it to the Army Relief fund. That is the greatness of SAM Sir. Whom will you salute now?

FAMILY PENSIONERS AND COMMUTED PENSION

Pensioners have the option to get the pension commuted at the time of their retirement.

If the pensioners opt for this, the commutation amount will be deducted on monthly basis from the pension for a pre-defined period of time.

However, if the pensioner unfortunately passes away before the completion of above mentioned predefined period, the *family pensioner will get full pension without deduction of the commutation installment amount* (*Authority*: GOI, Ministry of Personnel letter No. 42/15/2022-P&PW(D)/ 5 dated 25th Oct, 2022).

PARADE AT FRANCE ON 14 JULY 23



Strains (musical) of "Sare Jahan Se Accha" rang through the Champs Elysées on 14 July 23 as a 269 member tri services Indian Military contingent, with connections to France dating back over a century to both World Wars, marching in France's Bastile Day Parade, saluted Chief Guest, Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron.

Bastile day is a national holiday in France and it marks the anniversary of the storming of the Bastile Fort in 1789, which symbolizes the beginning of French Revolution. The Parade began with a fly past by French

aircraft followed by a formation of three Rafale fighter jets of IAF. The marching contingents began marching as the fly past ended.

The IAF contingent in Paris comprised of four Rafale fighter jets, two C-17 globe masters and 72 IAF personnel. Sqn Ldr Sindhu Reddy, woman helicopter pilot (Alloutte / MI -17) led the IAF's marching contingent.

Many Indian Air Force officers, like Late Air Veteran Air Marshal Shiv Dev Singh, Late Air Veteran Air Marshal Hari Chand Dewan and Late Air Veteran Wg Cdr Jumbo Majumdar — fought over the skies of France during the two World Wars. Some, like Wg Cdr Jumbo Majumdar, were also decorated for their gallant actions over the Falaise Gap during the terminal phase of World War I.

IAF also has a long history of operating French aircraft, starting with the Ouragan, followed by fighter aircraft like the Breguet Alize, Mystere, and Mirage 2000, with the Rafale jets being the latest in this illustrious line. Helicopters Alouette-III and Lama continue to fly with the three services, acting as a lifeline in remote high altitude area.

IAF DESIGNATES 24 EQUIPENT DEPOT AS CENTRAL STOCK HOLDING DEPOT FOR C-295 AIRCRAFT SPARES

IAF is in the process of replacing the Avro-748 aircraft which were inducted into the IAF in early 1960s. These aircraft have rendered a yeomen's service and are still operative in large numbers. Keeping in mind the ever increasing operational requirement of the IAF, the MoD has already approved a project worth Rs. 21,935 Crores last year with Airbus Defence and Space for acquisition of C-295 aircraft. A total of 56 aircraft will be inducted into the IAF.

16 aircraft will be supplied in fly-away condition while remaining 40 aircraft will be assembled at Baroda under a joint venture between Tata Advance System Limited (TASL) and airbus.
