# President's Page

Dear Veterans,

t gives me immense pleasure to put up a few updates on modernization and capability enhancement of Indian Air Force, a prestigious organisation to which we all have contributed our youth and are greatly indebted.

- First C-295 aircraft arrived in India from Spain on 20 Sep 23 as a replacement to the ageing Avro aircraft.
- Delivery of LCA Mk1 Twin seater have commenced and the Honourable Prime Minister Sh Narendra Modi flew in this aircraft and becomes the first PM to fly a fighter aircraft
- Contracts for supply of additional 70 HTT 40 (basic trainer aircraft) and six Dornier 228 aircraft have been signed.
- Three Squadrons of Akash Missile System employing advanced Rajendra Mk-II radars have been commissioned this year.
- ❖ Induction of Heron Mk-II has bolstered the IAF capability to undertake surveillance and reconnaissance missions beyond Line of sight ranges at higher altitude of operations.
- ❖ IAF continued to train hard this year with Air Forces of Japan, France, UAE, Saudi Arabia, Greece, Egypt and US Air Force.
- Bharat Drone Shakti 2023, a Drone exhibition cum display event was organised by IAF and Drone federation of India at AF Station Hindon. By co-hosting the event IAF seeks to bolster the drone ecosphere of the country.

IAF conducted International human assistance and disaster relief in providing medicines and other relief material to Palestine citizens affected by the ongoing Israel - Hamas conflict on 22 Oct 23 and providing medical cum relief materials to Nepal after devastating earthquake struck on 05-06 Nov 23. Disaster Flood relief operations were conducted within the country also to provide medical and other relief material to villages marooned in Yavatmal Village of Maharashtra, Warangal , Sikkim . Tunnel rescue ops were conducted at Uttarakhand.

In addition many historic milestones have been achieved.

- An order for delivery of 83 LCA Mk 1A Tejas has been placed on HAL and Approval of Necessity (AON) for another 93 LCA Mk 1A Tejas aircraft has been accorded.
- GE Aerospace has signed an MOU with HAL to produce F-414 jet engines in India for IAF LCA Mk 2 programme.
- Women Empowerment Gp Capt Shaliza Dhami, a helicopter pilot becomes the first woman to command a flying unit in IAF.

On behalf of the Veteran community I would like to place on record my appreciations to the CAS and all the Air Warriors for taking IAF to greater heights and also for all their endeavors to help secure veterans financial, medical and canteen entitlements, thus bringing comfort and love to their erstwhile comrades in arms.

Pursuit of happiness has always been a collective aspiration. People have different ways at different times to perceive happiness, but the yearning for joy, contentment and a sense of well being is a universal phenomenon. It is evident from the activities at AFA branches captured briefly in photo gallery in this magazine that all the branches are working efficiently to bring cheer, comfort and happiness to the veteran AFA members and I wish them continued success in their endeavors.

Veteran satisfaction and welfare is our moto and together with your cooperation we shall continue to make efforts in this direction



### INDIA SUCCESSFULLY LAUNCHES ADITYA L-1



DITYA-L1 is a spacecraft launched by Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO). It is the first Indian mission dedicated to observing the Sun which has extremely high temperatures in the range of 6000° C to Ten Lack° C. Previously space agencies of Europe, USA, Japan and China have launched such missions.

Aditya-L1 was launched aboard the **PSLV C57** at **11:50 IST** on 0**2 September 2023**, ten days after the successful landing of ISRO's Moon mission, **Chandrayaan-3**. It successfully achieved its **intended orbit** nearly an hour later, and reached its designated orbit at the **L1 point** approximately **127 days** after its launch **(06 Jan 24)**.

It is orbiting at about 15 lack km from Earth. This

Distance is **one percent** of the distance of Sun from Earth which is app **1500 lack Km**. The mission has an allocated cost of app **Rs 400 crores** excluding launch costs and mission life of about **five years**. Aditya" is named after Surya (The Hindu deity) representing the Sun. The "L1" designation denotes Lagrange point 1 (the spacecraft's destination point between the Sun and Earth). The **1,500 kg** satellite carries seven science payloads including instruments as required for various research objectives in **Solar Physics**.

### SENGOL: INSTALLED AT NEW PARLIAMENT BUILDING



Il of you know that a new building for the Parliament has come up, which was inaugurated by the Honourable Prime Minister on 28 May 23. Some of you might have heard that **SENGOL** was installed in Parliament. I for one did not know about the SENGOL. May be many people might not have known about the same. So here is a small informative write up about SENGOL.

The Cholas reigned over portions of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Odisha, and Sri Lanka from 9<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> centuries. They had a practice of passing on a SCEPTRE (constructed out of gold or silver and frequently adorned with priceless stones) which was known as SENGOL. **SENGOL SCEPTRE** was traditionally passed from one Chola king to another as a symbol of legitimacy and succession.

The world **SENGOL** is derived from the Tamil word "**SEMMAI**" and means "Righteousness," The Emperors carried the Sengol sceptre during ceremonial events to symbolise their might.

The last British viceroy, Lord Mountbatten, intended to commemorate the historic occasion when the British ceremonially handed over authority to the Indians. Lord Mountbatten approached Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who apparently sought advice from Shri C Rajagopalachari. He apprised Pandit Nehru about the "Tamil Tradition" of passing SENGOL from one King to another on transfer of power prevalent during **Cholas Dynasty**.

Sengol', was thus received by India's first Prime Minister Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru to represent the transfer of power from the British to India. It was kept in a museum in Allahabad and has now been brought to Delhi and *installed in the new Parliament building* by Prime Minister Sh Narendra Modi.

# PRIME MINISTER FLIES IN THE INDIGENOUSLY DEVELOPED LIGHT COMBAT AIRCRAFT (TEJAS)



ttired in G suite Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi got a firsthand feel of the ADE designed and HAL produced indigenous Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) TEJAS as he took a sortie lasting 30 minutes in the trainer version of the aircraft flown by Group Captain Debanjan Mandal that took off from Bangalore.

PM flying in Tejas provided a big boost to Aatmanirbharta and recognition of growing Indian Defence manufacturing prowess. Shri Narendra Modi has been pushing for indigenous production of Defense products and boosting their manufacture in India and also the exports. Towards attaining this objective, IAF has plans to replace MiG-21 Squadrons with Tejas.

The LCA trainer is a light weight, all weather multirole aircraft which can undertake all roles of a single seat fighter and can also be used as a fighter trainer. This is the first time ever that an indigenous twin seat fighter has been designed, developed and

manufactured in India. With an amalgamation of contemporary concepts and technologies such as quadruplet fly-by-wire flight control, carefree maneuvering, advanced glass cockpit, integrated digital avionics systems and advanced composite materials for the airframe, it is a state-of-the-art aircraft.

IAF test crew has been involved with the Tejas project right from conceptual stage till prototype testing. The first version of the aircraft was inducted into the IAF in 2016. Currently, two squadrons of IAF, 45 Squadron and 18 Squadron, are fully operational with LCA Tejas. An order worth Rs.36,468 Crores for delivery of 83 LCA Mk 1A aircraft has been placed with HAL and delivery is scheduled to begin in 2024. The IAF will have 40 LCA, over 180 LCA Mark-1A and at least 120 LCA Mark-2 planes in the next 15 years. Argentina and Egypt Air Forces have also evinced interest in HAL's Light Combat Aircraft (LCA)

More than Rs.9000 Crores have been sanctioned for the development of LCA Mk 2, an updated and more lethal version of LCA Tejas. To further promote indigenization, Transfer of Technology (TOT) for manufacturing of the GE aero engine in India for Tejas aircraft has also been negotiated with GE Aerospace during Prime Minister's visit to the US in June 2023.

This sortie by the Prime Minister will stimulate growth of the Indian aeronautics ecosystem and give a big boost to Aatmanirbharta in defence sector and enhance India's Defense Exports.

### SHAHEED-E-AZAM BHAGAT SINGH



reedom fighters inspire and motivate others to fight for injustice. There is no doubt that they are the pillars behind the freedom movement. They made people aware of their rights and their power. Bhagat Singh, Mahatma Gandhi, Subhash Chandra Bose, Jawaharlal Nehru, Sardar Ballabhai Patel, Dr. BR Ambedkar, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Lala Lajpat Rai, Lal Bahadur Shastri, and Bal Gangadhar Tilak and many others played major role in bringing Independence to India.

Today we are recapitulating and remembering Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh, a national symbol of patriotism and a Martyr who willingly sacrificed his life for the cause of his nation. Bhagat Singh was born into a Punjabi Sikh family on **27 September 1907** in the village of Banga in the Lyallpur district of the Punjab in what was **then British India** and is **today Pakistan**.

He joined the National College in Lahore in **1923**, founded two years earlier by Lala Lajpat Rai in response to Mahatma Gandhi's non-cooperation movement, which urged Indian students to shun schools and colleges subsidized by the British Indian government.

He was arrested by the police in **May 1927** on the pretext that he had been involved in a bombing that had taken place in **Lahore** in **October 1926**. He was released on a surety of Rs.60,000 five weeks after his arrest. In **December 1928**, Bhagat Singh and an associate, Shivaram Rajguru, both members of a small revolutionary group, the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association , shot dead a **21-year-old** British police officer, **John Saunders**, in Lahore, Punjab, mistaking Saunders, for the British senior police superintendent, **James Scott**, whom they had intended to assassinate.

Bhagat Singh held Scott responsible for the death of a popular Indian nationalist leader Lala Lajpat Rai for having ordered a lathi (baton) charge in which Lala Jee was injured and two weeks thereafter died of a heart attack.

As Saunders exited a police station on a motorcycle, he was felled by a single bullet fired from across the street by Rajguru, a marksman. As he lay injured, he was shot at close range several times by Bhagat Singh. The postmortem report showed eight bullet wounds. Another associate of Singh, Chandra Shekhar Azad, shot dead an Indian police head constable, Channan Singh, who attempted to give chase as Bhagat Singh and Rajguru fled.

Bhagat Singh was thereafter on the run for many months. Surfacing again in **April 1929**, he and another associate, **Batukeshwar Dutt**, set off two low-intensity homemade bombs, among some unoccupied benches of the Central Legislative Assembly in Delhi. They showered leaflets from the gallery on the legislators below, shouted slogans, and allowed the authorities to arrest them.

Bhagat Singh was executed on **23 March 1931** along with his comrades Rajguru and Sukhdev. Legend says, Bhagat Singh marched to the gallows with a smile on his face and his one last act of defiance was shouting **Inquilab Zindabad (Long Live Revolution)**. His death inspired hundreds to take up the cause of the freedom movement.

Over the years many directors of Bollywood have come forward to pay tributes to the legendary, revolutionary Bhagat Singh and made prominent Hindi films like **Shaheed - e-Azam Bhagat Singh (1954)**, **Shaheed Bhagat Singh (1963)**, **Shaheed (1965)**, **Shaheed (2002)**, **Rang De Basanti (2006)** and many more.

His sacrifice and unwavering dedication to the cause of India's freedom struggle shall continue to inspire generations to come.

ASIAN GAMES: Raksha Mantri announced cash prizes to Armed Forces personnel for winning medals at the 19th Asian Games. India's performance at the 2023 Asian Games, which were held from 23 Sep to 08 Oct 2023 in China has been historic, achieving a record-breaking medal tally of 107, which includes 28 Golds. Armed forces contingent comprised of 88 sportspersons who participated in 18 disciplines at the Games.

Indian armed forces contributed in a big way to earn laurels for the country by bagging 16 individual medals (03 Gold, 06 Silver & 07 Bronze) and eight team medals (02 Gold, 03 Silver & 03 Bronze) at the Games.

Honourable Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh Ji, on October 17, 2023, felicitated medal winners, participants and support staff from the Armed Forces, who took part in the recently concluded 19th Asian Games at Hangzhou, China. It was announced that Gold medal winners will be given Rs 25 lakh; Silver medal winners will get Rs 15 lakh and Bronze medal winners will be awarded Rs 10 lakh.

Sgt Naveen Kumar (Gold medal, Kabaddi), Sgt Mijo Chako (Gold medal, Athletics) and Sgt MD Afsal (Silvermedal Athletics) brought glory to the IAF and to the nation. Heartiest Congratulations to all Winners and participants from team AFA.







### MY BRUSH WITH SAINIK WELFARE BY VETERAN GP CAPT MG SHETTY



Gp Capt MG Shetty (Contact No – 7259007390) retired as CSO (Air) SWAC and joined as District Sainik Welfare Officer (DWSO) at the remote town of Ambikapur in Chhattisgarh. He was of great help to the ESM to secure their entitlements of pensions, medical benefits and canteen facilities. Lessons learnt from a few instances as given below are of immense use to all air veterans.

**PENSIONER MISSING:** As a ritual in the annual Sanik Sammelan in Balarampur District (One of the three districts looked after by DSWO Ambikapur), we paid homage to **80 Yrs old ESM** who had recently passed away. We could not locate his widow to know her welfare. It was realised

that she had moved to her maternal home in Jharkhand after demise of her husband. For curiosity, we rang her up to find out if she has started getting family pension. To our utter disbelief we found that she was absolutely unaware of any of the financial benefits post her husband's death.

We had to call her and initiate the procedure from arranging her husband's death certificate, issue of new **PPO** and facilitate payment of family pension. Entire procedure took more than **six months**. It is the primary duty of ESM to educate his dependents of their rights and responsibilities in case of his sudden demise to avoid unnecessary hardships.

<u>MISMATCH IN DETAILS OF SPOUSE:</u> Serving soldier loses his spouse but fails to report at unit and to get **Part-II orders** promulgated. This soldier gets remarried and does not take any action to correct the documents. He also gets additional member in the family along with existing two children from first wife.

During discharge, he merely uses photographs of new spouse along with details of the first spouse. ESM expires three years after retirement. **PCDA** refuses to pay pension to second wife as her documents like **ADHAAR** and **PAN** do not match with **documents of ESM**.

It was a herculean task to get **Part II Orders** through Records and to re-issue PPO in the name of second wife and her child. **It is extremely important to update the personal documents by serving personnel during service.** 

**DEATH IN HARNESS:** ESM deserts his wife in the village and starts living with another woman of his choice in the town. Neither ESM nor the family makes any efforts to contact each other for more than ten years. One fine day son of ESM reports to **District Sainik Welfare Officer (DSWO)** with death Certificate of ESM which occurred more than six years back. PCDA and Regional Office of the Bank refuse to divulge details of last pension drawn by the ESM till intervention by top hierarchy of pension authorities. Pension was restored after more than a year's struggle by the widow and DSWO. **Immediate reporting of death of ESM to PCDA and concerned authorities will help in solving most of the otherwise avoidable hardships.** 

### MEDICAL FITNESS CERTIFICATE FOR ECHS BENEFICIARIES

Due to lack of information and knowledge many ECHS beneficiaries are not being issued medical certificate, sickness certificate, and endorsement of Medical / Dental officer remarks for driving license and Govt jobs at ECHS Polyclinics.

The rule position is very clear and is clarified in "SOP for treatment management 2018" issued by MD ECHS that Medical Officer / Dental Officer at ECHS Polyclinics are AMA (Authorised Medical Attendant) of beneficiaries and a specific time slot of 3 pm to 4 pm has been allocated for this purpose at all polyclinics.

New IAF Ensign Unveiled: Chief of Air Staff Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari unveiled a new ensign of the IAF, replacing the existing one that was adopted more than seven decades back. In the new ensign, the IAF Crest features in the top right corner of the ensign, towards the fly side. The IAF Crest has the National symbol, the Ashoka lion on the top with the words 'Satyameva Jayate' in Devanagari below it. Below the Ashoka lion is a Himalayan eagle with its wings spread, denoting the fighting qualities of the IAF. A ring in light blue colour encircles the Himalayan eagle

with the words 'BHARTIYA VAYU SENA.

**TOUCH THE SKY WITH THE GLORY**' as taken from verse 24 of Chapter 11 of Bhagwat Geeta is inscribed below Himalayan eagle in Devanagari.

The IAF Ensign was presented to the Air Chief by four air warriors. As the Air Chief unveiled the new Ensign, two drones lifted a large flag from behind a curtain wall. The new Ensign was then hoisted, while the previous version lowered, folded with full honors, and handed over to the Air Chief. It will now become part of the exhibits at the Air Force Museum.



MiG-21 Farewell: At the Indian Air Force Day ceremony, MIG -21 planes of Russian origin made their last appearance. Air Chief Marshal V R Chaudhari announced the replacement of the Russian made MiG -21 with Indian-developed Tejas Mark 1A aircraft from 2025 onwards.

<u>Women Power:</u> It is the first IAF day parade commanded by woman officer, Gp Capt Shaliza Dhami. The parade also featured an all-women contingent consisting of the newly inducted Agniveer Vayu women. These 31 women air warriors marched alongside their male counterparts.

Air Display Along the Banks of Triveni Sangam in Prayagraj: Fly Past featured approximately 108 IAF aircraft, including Dhruv Advanced Light Helicopters from the Indian Army, a P-8I aircraft from the Indian Navy, Frontline fighters, Choppers, helicopter gunships and vintage aircraft. Air display included performances by the Sarang helicopter display team and

Surva Kiran Aerobatic Team and maiden flight of C-295.

Despite the scorching heat, countless people flocked to the Sangam area, cheering loudly as they witnessed this impressive display of aerial maneuvers.

### **RE-IMBURSEMENT OF MEDICAL EXPENSES**



# C 295 INDUCTION - BOOST TO IAF'S TRANSPORT FLEET AND INDIA'S TRANSPORT AIRCRAFT PRODUCTION ECOSYSTEM

"The induction of C-295 will bolster medium lift tactical capability of the IAF. The Defence and Aerospace sectors are the two important pillars for making India self-reliant in the coming years", tweeted Raksha Mantri, Rajnath Singh after he formally inducted the first C 295 MW at a special ceremony at Hindon airbase on 25 September 23. He handed over the symbolic key of the aircraft to Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari. Just a few days earlier, the Air Chief had received the first aircraft at Seville in Spain.

We all recall that PM Sh Narendra Modi had laid the foundation stone of the Tata-Airbus consortium's C-295 manufacturing facility in Vadodara, Gujarat, on October 30, 2022, which is the first plant in the private sector to make a military aircraft. In September 2021, Indian government had cleared the ₹21,935-crore (\$3 billion) Airbus-Tata project for fifty six C-295 MW military transport aircraft. Additional six may be acquired by Coast Guard.

The deal for replacing the old Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) license-built HS-748 (Avro) planes of Indian Air Force (IAF) entails delivery of 16 EADS-CASA twin-turboprop aircraft in a flyaway condition by M/s Airbus Defence and Space (Spain), scheduled to be delivered between September 2023 and August 2025. The rest 40 will be manufactured in India by the Tata Consortium with first aircraft likely to roll out in September 2026 and remaining 39 by August 2031.

Airbus CASA C-295 MW can carry 71 troops, 48 paratroopers, 27 stretchers, five  $2.24 \times 2.74$  m (88 × 108 inches) pallets, or three light vehicles. In fire-fighting role it could carry 7,000 liters of water or retardant. (Load carrying capacity 9.5 tones). It has low fuel consumption allowing nearly 13 hours endurance.

More than 200 aircraft are already flying world-wide. Another 80 more are on order. C295 has seen action in Chad, Iraq and Afghanistan. It routinely operates in the hot and humid conditions of the Brazilian jungle and Colombian mountains, in the dusty and very hot deserts of Egypt and Algeria, and in the extremely cold and icy winters of Poland, Finland and Kazakhstan. Clearly it is going to be a work-horse for the IAF.

Unlike the HS 748, C 295 aircraft has a rear ramp that will ease loading and unloading and para drops. The aircraft can operate from short or unprepared airstrips. It is well suited for operations in the valleys and advanced landing grounds in the Himalayas. The aircraft can carry more troops and cargo than the HS 748 and the An-32 transport planes. It has a better combination of range, speed and service ceiling. In the past IAF had converted its transport aircraft such as An 12 and An 32 for bombing role, such option could be possible in C295 also. In the long run, if India decides to extend the production line, it could also replace the depleting An 32.

Indian Railways achieves remarkable milestone towards **AATMANIRBHARTA** by flagging off the India's **first-ever indigenously** designed and manufactured semi-high speed **Vande Bharat train**. Vande Bharat Trains would gradually replace Shatabdi / Rajdhani express and provide modern and comfortable rail travel experience to the passengers. To ensure safe journey these trains are fitted with safety system named **KAVACH** (**An automatic train protection system**). Some of the special features of these trains are listed below:-

- Every Vande Bharat train is cleaned in 14 minutes.
- Faster acceleration and semi high speed operation up to 160 KMPH.
- Fully sealed gangway for free passenger movement and Automatic plug doors.
- Reclining Ergonomic Seats and Comfortable Seating with revolving seats in executive class.
- Mobile charging sockets for every seat.
- Driver-Guard communication with voice recording facility & Crash hardened memory.

BHEL led consortium with TWL (Titagarh Wagons Ltd) has been awarded a contract of Rs 23000 crore for manufacture of 80 Vande Bharat Trains. Cost of a 16 coach Vande Bharat Train is about Rs 1115 Crore. India is expected to have a total of 475 Vande Bharat Trains by 2025.

### **GLACIAL LAKE OUTBURST FLOOD (GLOF)**

IAF airlifts large number of tourists and local civilians stranded in Lachen and Lachung villages of Sikkim:- Airlift comes to the rescue of people after GLOF in South Lhmak Lake which created havoc across the Teesta basin in Sikkim and North Bengal. GLOF is a type of catastrophic flood that occurs when the dam containing a glacial lake fails, releasing a large volume of water. This type of flood is typically caused by rapid melting of glaciers or the build up of water in the lake due to heavy precipitation or the inflow of melted water.

IAF utilised a fleet of helicopters, namely, Cheetah, Chinook, Mi-17 1V, and Mi-17 V5 for the rescue operations. With 262 sorties, facilitating relief efforts of the Sikkim government, the Indian Air Force (IAF) has rescued around 2,000 people from the disaster-stricken areas, following the **flash floods**.

# INDIA'S 22 KM LONG SEA BRIDGE (MTHL) BECOMES LONGEST SEA BRIDGE



India has FIVE SEA bridges out of total of 15835 land / water briges. India's first sea bridge (PANBAN bridge) that connects the town of Mandapam in mainland India with, Rameswaram on Pamnan island, opened on 24 February 1914.

It was the longest sea bridge until the opening of Bandra -Worli sea link in 2010. However Mumbai Trans Harbour Link on the MHL project connecting Mumbai to Nai Mumbai (22 Km long) shall now become the India's longest Sea Bridge.

The Mumbai Trans Harbour Link, officially named as Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee Trans Harbour Link and also known as Sewri–Nhava Sheva Trans Harbour Link and colloquially as Atal Setu, is a 21.8 km (13.5 mi) 6-lane elevated highway bridge, which connects Mumbai with Navi Mumbai, its satellite city. It is the longest sea bridge in India, and the world's 12th longest sea bridge. The bridge begins in Sewri, South Mumbai, crosses Thane Creek north of Elephanta Island, and terminates at Chirle near Nhava Sheva in Uran taluka, Navi Mumbai. The road is linked to the Mumbai–Pune Expressway in the east and to the under-construction Coastal Road in the west. The 6-lane highway is 27 meters in width, in addition to two emergency exit lanes, two edge strips, parallel crash barriers and noise barriers on both sides. The project costs a total of Rs.17,843 crores. The bridge has a capacity to handle 70,000 vehicles per day. Construction on the bridge began in April 2018, and was inaugurated by Prime Minister Sh Narendra Modi on 12 January 2024.

### **COUNTRIES BY AREA**

There are 195 countries in the world today. This total comprises 193 countries that are member states of the United Nations and 2 countries that are non-member observer states, i.e. the Holy city and the State of Palestine.

### INDIAN YOUTUBERS: NET WORTH RANGES FROM RS 16 CRORES TO RS 360 CRORES.

- YouTuber is a type of social media influencer who presents content and uploads videos on American Online video sharing website YOUTUBE. Content creators can choose any area of their expertise (cooking, comedy, music, merchandise, education, technology, news, sports etc.)
- To qualify as a content creator, you must have at least 1000 subscribers and 4000 hours of accumulated viewership time over the previous twelve-month period. Google pays 55 % of the advertisement revenue to the content creator for every amount paid by the advertiser.
- Average rate of payment by Google is about 10 to 12 dollars per 1000 subscribers. The top YouTubers in India for 2023 include Carry Minati, Total Gaming, Techno Gamerz, Mr. Indian Hacker, Round2hell, Ashish Chanchlani, Sandeep Maheshwari, BB Ki Vines, Amit Bhadana, and Technical Guruji. The subscriber counts for these top YouTubers range from 22.9 million (Technical Guruji) to 38.3million(Carry Minati).



Veterans can type YouTubers names as mentioned above and watch the work of famous YouTubers on YouTube. These are new professions in vogue. With dedication, creativity, and consistent effort, Veterans can pursue a career as a YouTuber. It requires finding your unique niche, creating engaging content, and building a loyal audience over time.

**Tulsi village** (near Raipur) in central Chhattisgarh, home to about 4000 people, has every household engaged in creating YouTube video content. Of the 40 odd YouTube channels launched by the villagers here, Channel Chhattisgarhi boasts of 120000 subscribers. Most channels earn around Rs.20000 to Rs.40000 per month from YouTube.

RISK OF FRACTURE AMONGST ELDERLY: As one gets older the bones become brittle, fragile and easily breakable (Osteoporosis). Osteoporosis and broken bones are more common in women (after menopause) than men. The most common fractures sustained by elderly are fractures on the hip, pelvis, ankle and upper arm bone near the shoulder. Specific measures to reduce accidental fractures amongst the senior Air Veterans are listed below:-

- Never stand on a chair or stool to get something, even a low stool.
- > Do not wear underwear / trousers in bathroom, taking support of wall or other things... After bath, come back to your changing room. Sit comfortably on either a chair or on your bed and then put on underwear / trousers.
- ➤ While going to toilet, ensure that bathroom floor is dry and not slippery. Fix a hand rest to hold on to, while getting upright from the commode seat. Same is true while taking a bath sitting on bath stool.
- ➤ When getting up in the middle of the night, sit on the bed for 3-4 minutes, be sure to turn on the light first, and then get up.

### TECH ADVANCEMENT: AUTOMATED WEATHER STATIONS (AWS) - IAF

Old methods of **forecasting weather** by manually drawing charts have been **replaced** by **Automated Weather Stations** (AWS) which act as a thermometer, clock, sound level meter, hygrometer, anemometer and barometer. It also provides information on air quality, moon phase, or indoor pollution levels, everything that you need to get your own weather forecast.

Automatic Airport weather station is critical to ensuring **aviation safety** and **airport operations**. It can provide timely and accurate weather data to help managers make the right decisions and improve the efficiency and safety of airport operations.

India has **745** numbers of AWS, **1376** numbers of **Automatic Rain Gauge Stations (ARG)** and **200 numbers** of Agro AWS installed across the country.

Now IAF has signed contracts with **indigenous manufacturers** for installation of AWS at **82 locations**. This technological enhancement will provide major boost to **aerospace safety** by ensuring availability of real time weather updates during flying operations.

### **STROKE CHANCES**

# STRAIGHT BAT: CRICKET IN ARMED FORCES BY AIR MARSHAL PV ATHAWALE PVSM AVSM VSM (RETD)



The World Cup 2023 has reiterated a fact that cricket is a binding force in India especially when our team does well. Therefore, an average Indian may find it surprising that the Army has recently said 'NO' to cricket as a sport within the Army. As such, the services team for the recent T20 tournament comprised of only the Navy and the Air Force players. This is likely to happen for all national tournaments conducted by BCCI, including the prestigious Ranji Trophy.

It is feared that in due course of time, the Navy and the Air Force may also decide to stop participating in cricket tournaments outside their individual service. Even if they wish to continue, in absence of the Army, BCCI may not consider a depleted services side worthy of participation at the national level.

The current services cricketers are disappointed. Those who were enrolled as cricketers and who have rarely been with any unit are especially disheartened to see their (cricketing) careers finished. Many veteran cricketers also are emotional about this development. One of them exclaimed, "Sadly, there will be no services cricketers tomorrow!" Veteran cricketers see themselves getting completely cut off from their parent cricket board.

Well, let us look at this development dispassionately. It appears to be a well thought out decision. Just like the military is kept away from politics, it would be in the interest of the armed forces to keep this business, 'Cricket' away from their personnel. Some of the major changes since 1990s about the character of cricket and a cricketer will indicate the likely rationale behind Army's decision:-

- Until the 80s, there were only two national tournaments, Ranji Trophy and Duleep Trophy. For Duleep Trophy, only a few services cricketers represented North Zone. As such, a regular services cricketer was on sports duty for about three months, including Inter Unit, Inter Command, Inter Services, and the Ranji Trophy. He had to get back to unit and get more committed to work to compensate for his absence. A cricketer often compromised his annual leave as a compensation for his absence for cricket.
- Now, cricketers are permanently attached only to play cricket and are engaged round the year in national level tournaments. Besides their total absence from the units, they do not participate in local Inter Unit games also, which are otherwise meant to build team spirit and morale in the units.
- ➤ Besides the above, one of the most vital aspects is that cricket is more a BIG BUSINESS than a sport. With a single IPL contract, a cricketer would make far more money than his colleagues would earn in their whole careers. This would surely upset the balance in military and be counterproductive for maintenance of team spirit and morale.

We, the veteran cricketers have a reason to feel disappointed. However, I am sure that tomorrow none of us would wish to see a veteran services cricketer, who has not been a worthy military man first. Cricket within the armed forces without professional cricketers shall be far more enjoyable and team builder than at present.

# INDIAN JUGGAD: (MOTIVATION TO BE AN ACHIEVER)

On 12 November 23, work on a section of the Silkyara Bend - Barkot tunnel planned to connect National highway 134 in Uttrakhand (part of Char Dham Highway project) stopped because of landslide causing collapse of tunnel and blocking of the passage by more than 60 meters of concrete, rubble and twisted metal, thus leaving 41 workers trapped inside the broken tunnel.

Central Government, state Government and NDMA employed best of the human talent and machines to create a passage through 60 meter of collapsed tunnel debris to rescue 41 trapped workers. A large mechanical drill managed to get through substantial part of blocked debris but with about 12 meters to go the drill blade broke and broken machinery parts had to be pulled out, jeopardizing the rescue operation. Alternative options like vertical drilling etc were now employed but there was an uncertainty as to time line to reach the trapped workers.

It was now at these uncertain times and critical juncture that **Rat Hole Miners** were called in. Rat hole mining is a method of taking out coal by digging small pits to remove all debris by bare hands and burrow narrow holes like rats (though banned by Govt in 2014 because of its inherent underlying dangers to human life).

On 28 November 23, a team of rat hole miners were brought to Utrakhand to remove the last 12 meters of debris. This team worked continuously for 24 hours to reach the trapped workers. Muna Quereshi became the Hero rescuer, when he removed the last rock and became the first person and a saviour to make an eye to eye contact with the 41 trapped workers. On 29 November 23, all

forty one rescued workers were airlifted to AIIMS Rishikesh aboard an IAF CH -47 Chinook helicopter.

Long live the spirit of Rat Hole miner Munna Quereshi and all fellow rescuers.

Once again it was Indian Juggad that worked. In the end this JUGGAD by Rat Hole Miners was a triumph of human labour over machinery that managed to manually breakthrough the final 12 meters of rubble and successfully completed the rescue operation.

### DADASAHEB PHALKE AWARD: OVERVIEW


The Dadasaheb Phalke Award, (India's highest award in the field of Cinema) was installed in 1969. Dhundhi Raj Govind Phalke (1870–1944) popularly known as Dada Saheb Phalke was an Indian producer-director, screenwriter known as "The Father of Indian Cinema". His debut film Raja Harish Chandra was the first Indian movie to be released in 1913. He made 95 feature length films and 27 short films. The award comprises of Swarna Kamal (Golden Lotus), medallion, a shawl, and a cash prize of Rs Ten Lack. The first recipient of the award was actress Devika Rani.

POSTHUMOUS AWARDEES: Prithviraj Kapoor (1971) and Vinod Khanna (2017) are the only posthumous recipients. Prithviraj Kapoor died on 29 May 1972, at the age of 65. He was posthumously awarded for the year 1971. In 1972, Raj Kapoor received the posthumous award given to his father, (Prithviraj Kapoor). However, on **01 May 1988**, when Raj Kapur himself, was being conferred the award by the then President of India, R. Venkataraman, Raj Kapoor collapsed at the event and was rushed in the President's ambulance to AIIMS. Raj Kapoor died a month later on 02 June 1988. Vinod Khanna died on 27 **April 2017**, at the age of **70**. He was **posthumously** awarded for the year **2017**.

### INTERESTING CRICKET FACTS: THAT WILL AMAZE YOU!

- Iftikhar Ali Khan Pataudi (Grand Father of Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan) is the only cricketer to have played Test cricket for both India and England. He scored a century on his debut for England and was named captain of India when he first appeared on the Indian team in 1946.
- Sachin Tendulkar played for Pakistan once: Sachin Tendulkar once fielded for Pakistan against India in Mumbai in 1987, two years before making his international debut. This was because he had to fill in for Javed Miandad, in the exhibition match held in Mumbai.
- The longest test cricket match ever: It lasted 9 days (03 Mar-14 Mar 1939), when the test match was played on until one team wins or there is a tie. 680 overs were bowled between teams of **South Africa** and **England**. Match earned the name **The Timeless Test**.
- 19 wickets in one match: (Eng Vs Aus): Jim Laker of England took a total of 19 wickets against Australia at a test match at old Trafford in 1956 for 90 runs. 9 for 37 in first innings and 10 for 53 in second innings.
- **3-over century**: Sir Don Bradman, regarded as the greatest batsman of all-time, once scored a century in 1931 in just 3 overs. In those days, an over constituted of eight deliveries. In 18 minutes, Sir Don had crossed the century mark.
- Twenty one Consecutive maiden overs in a match: Indian spinner Rameshchandra Gangaram Nadkarni once bowled 21 consecutive overs (without conceding a single run) in a test match in England.

Air Marshal Sadhna Saxena Nair VSM is effectively only the second woman Medical Branch Officer who has served throughout in the IAF till promoted to the rank of Air Marshal; the first woman officer to achieve this milestone was Padma Shri Air Marshal Padma Bandopadhyay (Retd).

Air Marshal Sadhna is the wife of Air Marshal KP Nair (Retd). The Nairs also happen to be the first and only Air Marshal couple in the IAF. She also has the unique

distinction of being a **daughter and sister** of IAF doctors and of being a **wife and mother** of IAF Fighter Pilots. **Three generations** of her family have served in the IAF over the last seven decades.

<u>The Third International Airport</u> in Punjab after Amritsar and Chandigarh is being constructed at IAF Station Halwara in Ludhiana. The airport is being built to accommodate **Boeing 737-700** and **Airbus A-320 aircraft**.

### VANDE MATRAM

Vande Mataram, also spelt as **Bande Mataram**; (I praise you, Motherland) is a poem which has been written in **Sanskrit** and **Sanskritised Bengali** by **Bankim Chandra Chatterjee** in the **1870s.** The first two verses of the poem were adopted as the **National Song of India** in **October 1937**. The author of the poem was an Indian novelist, poet, essayist and journalist. He was author of the Bengali language novel **Anand Math** which is one of the landmarks of modern Bengali and Indian literature.

The poem played a vital role in the Indian independence movement. It first gained political significance when it was recited by *Rabindranath Tagore* at Congress General Meeting in 1896. By 1905, it had become quite popular amongst political activists and freedom fighters as a marching song. The song, as well as Anand Math, were banned under British colonial rule, (under threat of imprisonment), making its use revolutionary. The ban was ultimately overturned by the Government of India upon independence in 1947.

On 24 January **1950**, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted Vande Mataram as the **Republic's National Song**. President of India **Dr Rajendra Prasad** stated that the song should be honoured equally with the **National Anthem of India, Jana Gana Mana**.

Unlike the national anthem, there are no rules or decorum to be observed when reciting **Vande Mataram**.

Let us all take pride in this and remember the full poem by heart. - Jai Hind

# CHIEF OF AIR STAFF LEADS SWACHH BHARAT MISSION EK TAREEKH - EK GHANTA - EK SAATH





### GLOBAL WARMING AND GREEN HOUSE GASES

Greenhouse gases, also known as **GHGs**, are gases in the earth's atmosphere that **trap heat**. During the day, the sun shines through the atmosphere, warming the earth's surface. At night the earth's surface cools, releasing heat back into the air. But some of the heat is trapped by the GREEN HOUSE GASES (carbon dioxide, methane, water vapour, nitrous oxide, ozone and fluorinated gases etc.) in the atmosphere. That's what keeps the earth's temperature at required average of **14°C** (57°F).

Levels of green house gases are constantly **rising** thus blocking escape of heat and making earth warmer, causing change of weather patterns and disturbing the ecological balance of the earth. These gases are **generated** by burning of fossil fuels **(petrol / diesel etc)** to meet global energy needs of electricity, transportation, factories etc. This rise of global temperature causes **phenomena of Climate Change / Global warming.** 

Rise of Global temperatures beyond **2°C** above pre industrial global temperature of **14°C** in the year **1800**, shall cause irreversible change of ocean surface water temperature, rise of sea levels by **20 cm** resulting in coastal flooding, beach erosion, jungle fires, extreme heat, draughts, landslides and hurricanes. With an increase of **2°C** approximately **13% of land**, oceans, forests would suffer irrevocable imbalances in their flora and fauna and cause irreversible damage to terrestrial and marine areas.

Devastating floods have hit Libya, India, Greece and China. Brazil is seeing one of the worst draughts. Canada and Hawai saw raging wild fires. Droughts are expected to be more frequent in north-western India, Jharkhand, Orissa, and Chhattisgarh. Crop yields are expected to fall significantly because of extreme heat. Coastal states of USA like Florida and South Carolina are most at risk because of the impacts of climate change.

Therefore, there is a need to **deploy alternative sources of energy** (wind energy, solar energy, hydrogen fuel, Hyder energy etc) and **reduce use of fossil fuels**.

Nations World wide have agreed, under the aegis of Earth Summit in 1992 and Universal Paris Agreement in December 2015 and annual Conference of Parties with last one as COP-28 at Dubai, to adapt measures to keep Global Warming to no more than 1.5°C by reducing Greenhouse gas emissions by 45 % and reach NET ZERO (achieving a balance between the Carbons emitted into the atmosphere and the carbon removed by the atmosphere) by 2050.

We can all help to limit climate change by saving energy / electricity consumption from the way we travel ( walk, cycle, public transport) and from saving electricity consumption at home ( use of LED lights, solar energy ) and by other means such as plant a tree, turning off electricity devices when not in use etc.

### LIGHT COMBAT AIRCRAFT (A GREAT EFFORT TOWARDS ATMANIRBHAR BHARAT)

The year was January 2001 (4th January 2001 to be precise). All global eyes were riveted on India. A Euphoric moment. The successful, FIRST FLIGHT of the completely composite material Light Combat Aircraft. What an occasion that was and that which laid the pedestal for what we have today in its various versions. It silenced many critics who had commented otherwise on India's Aeronautical capability.

As retired Defence Personnel, it gives us a sense of pride and pleasure to see our country one among the peers of the Aeronautical fraternity of the world with the Light Combat Aircraft now in our inventory.

Great organisations like Aeronautical Development Agency and its associated huge network of DRDO Labs and PSU subsidiaries duly supported by IAF, made it worthwhile to make India Proud since 2001.

**LCA Mk 1& 1A**: In the last 23 years, we have crossed many milestones in the LCA Programme. As is with any aeronautical aircraft programme across the world, we too have moved to the development of a newer version, or rather an Upgrade called the LCA Mk 1A which is presently undergoing trials of its prototype version. The LCA will have the following main characteristics: -

- The first and only Composite Material combat aircraft
- A fully Indigenous Autopilot and Fly-by-Wire System with quadruple digital control permitting greater flexibility.
- A complete Glass Cockpit embedded with most advanced indigenous avionics and Electronic Warfare Suite.
- Higher and efficient safety systems for both pilot and ground safety.
- Completely indigenous infrastructure test facilities across India for various systems and subsystems

**LCA Mk 2**: As we are aware, the IAF is well short of the total number of squadrons required for a two front situation. This has resulted in the IAF giving go ahead to DRDO for the LCA Mk 2 aircraft (Medium Combat Aircraft). This design has already completed its Critical Design Review (CDR) and is on the production drawing board for its prototype. This aircraft will have the following additional facilities:-

- A new aircraft design with full Delta wing and Canards
- Will have a more enhanced thrust engine to cater for additional loads
- An entirely new indigenous electronic warfare suite from Indian DRDO stables
- New Integrated Health and Monitoring systems for better Prognostics Maintenance
- New class of weapons both indigenous and imported to help provide the desired firepower.

A very recent 30 minutes sortie by our Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given a further push to this programme.

### NOBEL PRIZE: INSTITUTED IN 1901, GREEN GOLD MEDAL WITH PRIZE MONEY OF RS 8.1 CRORE



Alfred Bernhard Nobel (21 October 1833 – 10 December 1896) was a Swedish chemist, engineer, inventor, businessman, and philanthropist. He made several important contributions to science and held 355 patents in his lifetime. Nobel's most famous invention was Dynamite.

Nobel displayed an early aptitude for science and learning, particularly in chemistry and languages; he became fluent in six languages and filed his first patent at the age of twenty four. The synthetic element Nobelium was named after him.

# NOBEL PRIZE: INSTITUTED IN 1901, GREEN GOLD MEDAL WITH PRIZE MONEY OF RS 8.1 CRORE

He passed away in the year 1896. In his will, he bequeathed all of his assets to be used to establish five prizes which became to be known as "Nobel Prizes." Nobel Prizes were first awarded in 1901 to those who "conferred the greatest benefit to humankind". The prize distribution ceremony takes place annually. Each recipient (known as a "laureate") receives a green gold medal plated with 24 karat gold, a diploma, and a monetary award of Rs 8.1 Crore. Nobel Prizes are not awarded posthumously.

# **INVENTION OF AUTOMATIC CASH DISPENSER (ATM)**

Now a days Automatic Cash Dispensing Machines are provided by all leading Banks and the same are being used by almost everyone across the globe. ATM has facilitated the financial transaction/availability of money round the clock. This also helps in saving man hours which were earlier being wasted in long queues at the banks. You will be surprised to learn that the very idea to have a cash dispensing machine was originally conceived by **an Indian** which was further supported in its implementation by another Indian of world fame.

**Two Indians**, Shepherd Barron (Born Shillong) on **23 June 1925** and OBE awardee (Order of British Empire) and great Indian mathematician **Srinivas Ramanujam** (Born Madras) gave **automatic cash dispenser** to the world.

John Shepherd Barron's Scottish father, Wilfred Shepherd-Barron, was Chief Engineer of the Chittagong Port in Bengal. During **World War II**, John was commissioned into the Airborne Forces and later served in the **Indian Army** in Second Airborne division where he taught Gurkhas to parachute. Inspiration for automatic cash dispenser came to John Shepherd-Barron while he was sitting in the bath, cursing his own tardiness. He had gone to his bank to withdraw cash but arrived a minute after closing time one day in the **mid-1960s**, leaving him with no funds for the weekend. "Wouldn't it be a good idea if there was some way of obtaining money outside regular working hours?" he mused. **Vending machines**, which allowed him to buy chocolate at any time of day or night, sprang to his mind. Thus, Shepherd-Barron devised a system for automatically dispensing cash.

Barclays commissioned Shepherd-Barron to build **six automatic cash dispensers**, the first of which was installed at a branch in the north London suburb of Enfield on **June 27**, **1967**.

He also invented the **PIN** by recalling his Indian **Army number**. He had originally intended to make **Personal Identification Numbers (PINs) six** digit long, but reduced the number to four when his wife, Caroline, complained that six digit was too many." Over the kitchen table, she said she could only remember four figures, so because of her, four digit became the world standard," he recalled.

Also the cash dispensing machine arranges the correct money to be dispensed according to Partition Theory of Srinivas Ramanujan (mathematical genius of India). Imagine you need to withdraw Rs 1900 from the ATM and Rs 500, Rs 200 and Rs 100 notes are available in machine, Ramanujan Partition theory shall guide the ATM to select the optimal combination. In this case if shall choose to dispense three Rs 500 notes and two Rs 200 notes.

So remember great Indian connection to ATM when you withdraw cash from ATM.

Air Vice Marshal Amit Tyagi, Vice President AFA, AVM AK Pan, AVM Rajesh Bhandari and Gp Capt CS Chandel, Secy AFA visited the residence of veteran Gp Capt Vidhya Rattan on 05 Dec 23 to convey him birthday greetings and to felicitate him on behalf of President AFA and all members of AFA. Brief narrative of his service career is given below:

It was in the year of 1946 when the country was about to regain independence and young Indians were full of hope and aspirations, when the young Rattan joined the Royal Indian Air Force (RIAF) in the flying branch and later the Equipment branch as it was known during those days.

He Joined Elementary Flying School in Jodhpur in 1946 and flew Tiger Moths there. After passing out from EFS, he was posted to Advanced Flying School at Ambala where he flew Harvard.

One day his instructor asked him to fly Harvard 2B with him to Delhi at night. It was an incident free journey to and back from Delhi. After landing at Delhi, he was asked to do a solo sortie of going around the airfield. Harvard 2Bs had the inherent defect of turning turtle upon veering to the left or right. And as the luck would have it, same happened with him that day. The defect was rectified in the later version T6G.

To cut the story short he was produced before his commanding officer, the then, Wg Cdr Arjan Singh (later Marshal of the Air Force) by his instructor, the then, Fg Offr Dilbagh Singh (later Chief of Air Staff). He was advised by Wg Cdr Arjan Singh that he could be re-streamed into Navigation which he refused. However he was offered to join the Equipment Branch in the year 1948 which he accepted. He had a tenure in UK as a Flt Lt and also commanded 26ED where he got promoted to the rank of Gp Capt.

Both his sons also joined IAF, Naveen Rattan in the medical branch who superannuated as Air Vice Marshal and his younger son Shailesh Rattan in the logistics branch who took premature retirement as Wg Cdr due to family reasons.

Let us all pray for his continued good health.



Good news is that all bank customers can now complain to Reserve Bank Ombudsman regarding deficient services by their PSU banks or Non PSU banks. ### **RICHEST ROYAL IN THE WORLD**



As of 2023, there are 43 sovereign states in the world with a monarch as head of each state. King Maha Vajiralongkorn of Thailand. (Born 28 July 1952 in Bangkok) is the tenth Monarch of Chakri Dynasty and is the richest monarch in the world. He is also styled as RAMA X (10) with estimated net worth of 43 Billion US Dollars.

He owns 6,560 hectares of land and has 40,000 rental contracts throughout the country, including 17,000 in Bangkok. On these lands, there are numerous government buildings, as well as malls and hotels. According to sources, King Maha Vajiralongkorn controls 23% of Thailand's second-largest bank, Siam

Commercial Bank, and 33.33% of Siam Cement Group, the country's largest industrial conglomerate. And if all that wasn't enough, the Thai king also holds the possession of the Golden Jubilee Diamond, which is the largest cut and faceted diamond in the world.

Thai King possesses 38 aircraft, including 21 helicopters. This comprises Boeing, Airbus, and Sukhoi Superjet aircraft.
